The Miami Herald, August 11, 1963, page 16-A, The TIPOFF -- An Inside Look -- Behind the News Scenes

".....Rumors are going around that a neo-Nazi group is being formed among Miami's Cuban refugee population. The leader is a 24-year-old Cuban who proudly notes he looks like Hitler....."

In regard to another matter, I believe I sent you several notes relating to the Intercontinental Penetration Force and to an April, 1963, speech by Fidel Castro. A curious reference appears relative to a story in the New York Times. If you accept my version, (God forbid!) it would appear that the Times carried a UPI dispatch a full day before it was moved over the wires; quite a feat! ~~even for the New York Times~~ I'm sure you know the ~~wrong~~ article I am referring to. Unfortunately, I failed to retain a carbon copy of the material, and I am not sure as to which article is in error due to a striking similarity of dates. The story stating that Dr. Castro charged the United States abandoned plans for a second invasion in favor of a plot to assassinate Cuban leaders appeared in the April 21, 1963, issue. It was datelined Havana, April 20, 1963, and was carried over the wires of the United Press International. Exactly two months later, on June 21, 1963, a story appeared concerning the Intercontinental Penetration Force, and it was datelined Miami, June 20, 1963, and carried over the wires of the United Press International.
