

Dallas, March 12 (AP)- Mrs. Marguerite Oswald stalked angrily away from the Texas School Book Depository today after she was denied entrance to the historic site.

"Do you know who I am?" she demanded of an attendant who told her she could not enter.

"I'm the mother of the accused assassin."

"I know who you are," the man replied, "but I can't let anyone in. That's the order from the president of the company."

"If the mother of the accuses assassin can't get in, there's something mighty peculiar....and fishy here," the 56-year-old practical nurse exclaimed.

She said her "personal investigation" of the Nov. 22 assassination apparently has resulted in a "lot of people getting shaky."

Mrs. Oswald arrived in Dallas Monday night to attend the trial of Jack Ruby, who killed her son two days after Oswald was charged with the assassination of President Kennedy.

She had visited the depository earlier in the week and questioned employes about her son's activities on Nov. 22.

Mrs. Oswald said she sought to enter the building again today to go to the sixth floor, from where police say the assassin's bullets were fired.

As she left, Roy Truly, the depository manager, commented "we're not running a scenic tour here."

Earlier today she scoffed at the possibility that Ruby might be acquitted of killing her son.

"It's preposterous to even think this thing," she cried. "It's impossible. It would be a slap in the face of American justice."

Asked her reaction should Ruby be found insane, which is the defense contention, she replied:

"Well, if a man's sick..... I would feel differently."
