Dallas, March 26 (AP)- The rifle used to assassinate President Kennedy and the pistol with which police officer J.D. Tippit was slain have been valued officially at \$10,000.

The weapons, owned by assassin Lee Harvey Oswald, were valued today by three appraisers appointed by county probate court.

At the same time Mrs. Marina Oswald was named by Probate Judge F.W. Bartlett Jr. as community administrator for the property. She was bonded in the amount of \$5,000 half the property's value, as required by law.

Also listed in the inventory were the four-power telescopic sight, a two-piece sling, and a cartridge clip, presumably the one from which three rounds were fired at President Kennedy and Gov. John Connally on Nov. 22, 1963.

Harry McKay, administrative assistant to Judge Bartlett, and one of three appraisers, said Mrs. Oswald's attorney indicated that a \$10,000 bid for the two weapons had been made by a gun collector.

The rifle originally was purchased by Oswald for \$12.95 from a mail-order house in Chicago.

William Blalock, attorney for Mrs. Oswald, said both weapons now are in the possession of the Department of Justice.

He said he is not sure what steps might be required to regain possession.

"I don't think the government has any right to keep them since the Warren Commission has finished its job. They belong to Mrs. Oswald and her children," he said.
