Washington, Oct. 1 (AP)- The Senate Judiciary Committee approved today without change a House-passed bill authorizing the government to acquire and preserve the rifle that killed President John F. Kennedy, and other items of evidence relating to the assassination.

The committee said it agreed with Atty. Gen. Nicholas Katzenbach that "in years ahead allegations and theories concerning President Kennedy's assassination may <sup>ABOUND</sup> ~~about~~" and that "to eliminate questions and doubts the physical evidence should be securely preserved."
