

Ruby Takes Lie Test For Warren

A lawyer for Jack Ruby said yesterday that Ruby "emphatically denied" in a lie detector test Saturday that there was any connection between him and Lee Harvey Oswald.

Defense attorney Joe Tonahill, in confirming that the polygraph test was given Ruby in the Dallas County Jail, said Ruby had requested the test from Chief Justice Earl Warren of the Supreme Court, who then ordered that it be given.

Ruby is under death sentence for gunning down Oswald, accused slayer of President Kennedy.

Results of the test will not be made public officially until the Warren Commission finishes its report, Tonahill said.

Tonahill said the polygraph test was administered by two FBI men, one from Austin and one from Dallas. Also on hand was Dr. William Beavers, Ruby's psychiatrist.

Tonahill said that he and Beavers were not in favor of the lie detector test. He added, however, that Ruby "had specifically requested it of the Chief Justice."

Lawyers for Ruby have contended he is insane.
