Dallas, Tex., July 22 (AP)- Dist. Judge Louis Holland said today he will hear tomorrow afternoon a request by Jack Ruby's attorneys for disqualification of the judge who presided over Ruby's trial.

Holland set a 1 p.m. ~~trial~~ time for the hearing, which was held over from today because ~~Holland~~ Holland's court didn't finish the trial of a murder case.

Attorneys for Ruby hope Holland will allow them to develop testimony on a book about the trial being written by Dist. Judge Joe B. Brown.

Brown presided over the 1964 trial, which resulted in a murder conviction and death sentence for Ruby on charges he killed presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald Nov. 24, 1963.

Prosecutors have asked Holland to forego a hearing, contending Brown's recent withdrawal from the Ruby case makes any disqualification hearing useless.
