RUBY SANITY TRIAL ORDERED TO PROCEED

DALLAS, June 10 (UPI)—District Judge Louis Holland today ordered a sanity trial for Jack L. Ruby to proceed on schedule Monday.

Judge Holland said that if Ruby's attorneys did not want to present a case he would appoint lawyers who would. However, Ruby's attorneys indicated they would present witnesses. Ruby has been sentenced to die for killing Lee Harvey Oswald, the assassin of President Kennedy.

Ruby's attorneys had said earlier that they would not contest the state's contention that Ruby is sane because to do so would deprive Ruby of his constitutional rights.

Joe Tonahill, a Ruby attorney, told Judge Holland, "My contention is that he is insane but there is nothing I or anybody else can do about it that would not deprive him of his constitutional rights."

District Attorney Henry Wade told Judge Holland the Ruby case had dragged on more than two years and that the appeal had never been heard. He said the state had never asked for a delay and unless a determination was made on Ruby's sanity, an appeal could not be heard.

Ruby was not in court today for the pre-trial hearing. The mainisubject of the hearing was a motion by Ruby's sister, Mrs. Eva Grant, withdrawing her earlier affidavit that her brother had become insane since he was convicted of murder.
