DALLAS, TEX., DEC. 5 (AP)-PROSECUTORS AND LAWYERS FOR JACK RUBY-WILL MEET TUESDAY WITH THE PRESIDING JUDGE IN THE CASE TO HOLD A PRELIMINARY TALK ABOUT A NEW TRIAL DATE AND SITE FOR RUBY, THE SLAYER OF LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

RUBY'S ATTORNEYS AND REPRESENTATIVES OF DIST. ATTY. HENRY WADE MET MONDAY AND PLANNED A TUESDAY MEETING WITH DIST. JUDGE LOUIS T. HOLLAND OF MONTAGUE, TEX.

PHIL BURLESON OF DALLAS, ONE OF RUBY'S ATTORNEYS, SAID THE CHANGE OF VENUE SITE FOR THE NEW TRIAL WOULD BE DISCUSSED.

THE TEXAS COURT OF CRIMINAL APPEALS OCT. 5 OVERTURNED THE MURDER CONVICTION OF RUBY AND ORDERED THAT ANY NEW TRIAL MUST BE HELD OUTSIDE OF DALLAS. RUBY SHOT DOWN OSWALD TWO DAYS AFTER PRESIDENT KENNEDY WAS ASSASSINATED IN DALLAS, NOV. 22, 1963.

OSWALD WAS IDENTIFIED BY THE WARREN COMMISSION AS PRESIDENT KENNEDY'S ASSASSIN.

JUDGE HOLLAND SUCCEEDED DALLAS DIST. JUDGE JOE B. BROWN AS THE PRESIDING JUDGE IN THE CASE. BROWN WAS THE JUDGE WHEN RUBY WAS CON-VICTED IN A DALLAS COURT.

THE TEXAS HIGH COURT, THROWING OUT RUBY'S CONVICTION, SAID CERTAIN POLICE TESTIMONY SHOULD NOT HAVE BEEN ALLOWED AND THAT THE TRIAL 'SHOULD HAVE BEEN MOVED OUTSIDE OF DALLAS.

BURLESON SAID THE FINAL TRIAL SITE WOULD BE COMPLETELY IN HOLLAND'S HANDS AND DENIED REPORTS THAT WICHITA FALLS, TEX., HAD BEEN AGREED UPON FOR THE TRIAL.
