Ruby: No Conspiracy In Killing of Oswald

NEW YORK (AP) — Jack Ruby insists in a recorded statement that there was no conspiracy involved in his killing of Lee Harvey Oswald, who the Warren commission named as the respective of Precident Leb the assassin of President John F. Kennedy.

Ruby made the recording se-cretly in Dallas' Parkland Me-morial Hospital where he lies gravely ill of cancer, according to Elmer Gertz, a member of Ruby's legal team.

In a telephone interview from Chicago last night, Gertz said Ruby's denial takes up three minutes of a 46-minute Capitol Record called "The Assassination."

The recording, which also features the voices of other persons central to the drama, was to be played in public for the first time at a news conference here today.

In an exclusive report Dec. 19, the Associated Press described Ruby as praying that he be given a final lie detector test to establish that there was no con-spiracy in his killing of Oswald.

Gertz said Ruby repeats these statements on the recording.

Ruby's brother, Earl, brought a small recorder into the hospi-tal room after the dying man
