WASHINGTON AP - Vice President Spiro T. Agnew led a host of mourners in paying final respects today to Allen W. Dulles, hailed by friend and foe alike as the master intelligence officer of his time.

Highly placed friends and associates of a career spanning the years before World War I through the Cold War, attended the funeral conducted at Georgetown Presbyterian Church by the Rev. Dr. Russel C. Stroup. Mourners included former Ambassador Averell Harriman, former Defense Secretaries Robert S. McNamara and Neil McElroy and Mrs. Alice Roosevelt Longworth, daughter of the late President Theodore Roosevelt and Secretary of State William P. Rogers.

The widow, Mrs. Clover Todd Dulles was accompanied to the funeral and later to Baltimore, where her husband's ashes will remain, by Richard Helms, present director of the Central Intelligence Agency which Dulles headed for nearly seven years.

Mr. Dulles died late Wednesday night at the age of 75 from pneumonia complications following a severe case of influenza.
