
FBI Shifts, Disciplines

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Another veteran FBI agent has been disciplined and transferred, Justice Department sources have disclosed.

The agent, Richard Rogge, 46, was transferred in July from Honolulu, where he was special agent in charge, to Richmond, Va., in the same capacity, sources said yesterday.

He is the third agent to have been transferred for disciplinary reasons since L. Patrick Gray III became acting director of the FBI in May.

It was understood that Rogge, an agent for 20 years, was transferred because of "internal difficulties."
