When the Women's Rights Law Reporter needed money to publish a quarterly on women's legal issues, they came to CLLDF.

In 1975, with prices and unemployment soaring, a 20% increase in rent could be devastating. When a Massachusetts tenants group came to CLLDF for an emergency grant to prepare a court battle to block the raise, they got it. At issue: the economic and civil rights of tenants.

And CLLDF made it possible for some other groups to publish information on selective service and military laws; and for community law offices to function without having to charge large fees.

In fact, CLLDF is the only civil liberties

organization which allocates funds to legal projects as well as to cases.


