

Notes on People

A \$100,000 interest in the estate of the late Clyde Tolson, longtime companion of the late J. Edgar Hoover, has been won by his brother, Hillory Tolson, in a Washington out-of-court settlement. The late director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation bequeathed \$500,000 to Clyde Tolson. When Mr. Tolson died last year, he left his estate to John P. Mohr, assistant F.B.I. director and seven other persons as well as two charities.

The Tolson will excluded Hillory, who is 78 years old and who had not seen his brother in 15 years. The successful suit argued that Mr. Mohr, who drafted the will, and other persons had used undue influence on Clyde Tolson to gain the estate.
