

Johnson to Visit Dallas First Time Since Nov. 22

BUTTE, Mont., Oct. 12 (AP) President Johnson is going back to Dallas Monday for the first time since the assassination of President Kennedy last Nov. 22.

Since then, security precautions around the new President have been strengthened.

For one thing, he has a heavily armored car with bullet-proof glass that it put aboard an Air Force cargo plane and is flown around the country.

For another, in the Secret Service follow-up car, an agent always faces backward now, scanning crowds, buildings and rooftops with an automatic rifle in his hands or at his fingertips.

Sunday, in the Long Beach, Calif. area, the gun was in hand and showed up in news photographs. There had been a police alert about a suspicious young man reportedly armed with a rifle with a telescope sight. The man later was reported to have been found at home.

In addition to the police on rooftops, security officers have now been added along the street and on bridges to strengthen Presidential protection. Helicopters prowl overhead on many occasions.

In New Orleans, on Friday, something new developed when Mr. Johnson's motorcade route ran parallel to a railroad. Railway police rolled down the track in an auto equipped with flanged wheels.
