Clint Hill, the Secret Service agent who clambered aboard the presiden-tial limousine when John F. Kennedy was assassinated in Dallas, was promoted to chief of the White House bodyguard.

 Rufus W. Youngblood, then chief of the secret service bodyguard for Lyndon B. Johnson, who threw himself over the then vice president at the time of the Dallas shooting four years ago, has been named to the newly

- Robert H. Taylor, formerly deputy to Johns in the protective forces division, is elevated to the position of deputy assistant director in charge of those forces.

shooting four years aso, been named to the newly created position of deputy director of the service. This means he will rank second only to Rowley in the organization.

Hill, who was asonching the bodyguard to Jacqueline Kennedy when she was First Lady, raced from the security car that followed the presidential limousine immediately after shots were atop the trunk.
