The director of the United States Passport Office indicates she favors a naational registration system, with everyone being given a number and possibly fingerprinted.

Frances G. Knight sees this not only as a possible first step toward international passport cards, but also as a move to correct faults in current identification meth-ods which result in "enormous tax evasion, social security frauds and national be well on our way toward crime."
