

Carr Plans Texas Report On Slaying

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) — Texas Atty. Gen. Waggoner Carr has said that he will release next week a "Texas report" on the assassination of President Kennedy.

Carr had said earlier he planned to "put on record the story of how Texas joined forces with the presidential commission in making the investigation."

Carr said his brief report will be issued "within a week" after the release of the presidential commission report, which was given to President Johnson Thursday.

In answer to a question, he said the report would be directed to Gov. John Connally, and that he has no intention of consulting with the Warren Commission or the President on the matter.

Carr revealed several days after the Nov. 22 assassination he planned to seek a court of inquiry—a fact-finding hearing by a justice of the peace—to investigate the murder.

He later said a court of inquiry would not be held unless one is necessary to develop any evidence not covered in the presidential commission's report.

Carr, meanwhile, named Dallas attorney Robert Storey and Leon Jaworski, Houston attorney and former prosecutor at the Nuremberg war criminal trials, to assist him in investigations.

The three have attended many sessions of the Warren Commission.
