AP1 DALLAS OUT (200)

DALLAS MARCH 22 (AP)-THE DALLAS PATROLMAN WHO CAPTURED ACCUSED ASSASSIN LEE HARVEY OSWALD HAS BEEN ASKED TO TESTIFY BEFORE THE WARREN COMMISSION ~~IN WASHINGTON~~ NEXT WEEK.

MAURICE (NICK) MCDONALD, NOW A DETECTIVE IN THE SPECIAL SERVICE BUREAU OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT, STRUGGLED WITH THE ARMED OSWALD IN A THEATER LESS THAN TWO HOURS AFTER PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY WAS ASSASSINATED.

OSWALD WAS CHARGED WITH THE PRESIDENT'S DEATH AND ALSO THE FATAL SHOOTING OF PATROLMAN J. D. TIPPIT FOLLOWING THE ASSASSINATION.

THE OFFICER IS EXPECTED TO TELL THE WARREN COMMISSION INVESTIGATING THE ASSASSINATION ABOUT HIS FIGHT WITH OSWALD AND THE SUBSEQUENT ARREST.

MCDONALD IS ONE OF 14 PERSONS BEING INFORMALLY INTERVIEWED IN DALLAS BY A COMMISSION INVESTIGATING TEAM. THE GROUP ALSO IS TAKING DEPOSITIONS FROM SOME 50 OTHER WITNESSES TO EVENTS SURROUNDING THE TRAGIC WEEKEND.

THERE HAD BEEN REPORTS THAT THE FULL COMMISSION MIGHT COME TO DALLAS TO INSPECT THE ASSASSINATION SITE.

THE DALLAS MORNING NEWS, HOWEVER, TODAY QUOTED A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION WHO ASKED THAT HIS NAME NOT BE USED AS SAYING "AT THIS POINT" NO MEMBERS PLAN TO COME TO DALLAS.

ALTHOUGH THE COMMISSION PLANS NO FULL-SCALE RE-ENACTMENT OF THE ASSASSINATION, A BRIEF TIME-LAPSE STUDY WAS MADE YESTERDAY AT THE TEXAS SCHOOL BOOK DEPOSITORY, FROM WHERE OFFICIALS SAY THE PRESIDENT WAS SHOT.
