**WARREN PANEL CALLS
OSWALD'S WIFE AGAIN**

WASHINGTON, June 2 (AP) —Mrs. Lee Harvey Oswald, widow of the man accused of killing President Kennedy, will testify again next week before the Warren Commission, which is investigating the assassination.

Mrs. Oswald, who testified early in the commission's hearings, will return June 11, the commission disclosed in announcing a list of scheduled witnesses.

The commission will hear this week from several Government agents closely connected with the investigation. Appearing

Thursday afternoon are two Federal Bureau of Investigation special agents, Lyndal L. Shaneyfelt and Robert A. Frazier, both of whom had testified earlier. Also scheduled are Leo Gauthier, an F.B.I. inspector, and Thomas J. Kelley, a Secret Service inspector.

Henry M. Wade, Dallas district attorney, and Sgt. Patrick T. Dean of the Dallas Police Department are to appear next Monday.

A number of present and former State Department officials and employes have been called to testify next Tuesday. They include Abram Chayes, the department's legal adviser, and Abba P. Schwartz, administrator of the Bureau of Security and Consular Affairs.
