WITH WARREN COMMISSION--CONNALLY REACTION

AUSTIN, TEX., SEPT. 27 (AP)-STILL NOT COMPLETELY RECOVERED FROM HIS GUNSHOT WOUNDS OF NOV. 22, TEXAS GOV. JOHN CONNALLY SAID TODAY THE WARREN COMMISSION REPORT EVOKES PAINFUL MEMORIES OF THE DETAILS OF THAT TRAGIC DAY.

"IT BRINGS INTO FOCUS ALL THE MEMORIES AND FORCES ME TO RECALL THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE TRAGEDY--WHICH YOU TRY TO PUT OUT OF YOUR MIND. MRS. CONNALLY AND I DON'T TALK ABOUT IT," HE TOLD NEWSMEN.

THE GOVERNOR CONSENTED TO A RARE SUNDAY NEWS CONFERENCE AFTER HIS OFFICE RECEIVED NUMEROUS REQUESTS FOR COMMENT ON THE REPORT. HE STRODE INTO HIS OFFICIAL RECEPTION ROOM HOLDING A BLUE, PAPER-BOUND COPY OF THE DOCUMENT, WHICH HE RECEIVED LAST WEEK WHEN HE VISITED PRESIDENT JOHNSON AT THE WHITE HOUSE.

CONNALLY WAS WOUNDED IN THE SAME FLURRY OF SHOTS THAT KILLED PRESIDENT KENNEDY. THE GOVERNOR WAS IN ^{a Jump} ~~THE FRONT~~ SEAT OF THE LIMOUSINE IN WHICH THE PRESIDENT WAS RIDING WHEN FATALLY SHOT. THE WARREN REPORT SAID THERE WAS "VERY PERSUASIVE EVIDENCE" THAT CONNALLY'S WOUNDS IN THE RIGHT WRIST, RIGHT SIDE AND LEFT THIGH CAME FROM A BULLET WHICH HAD PIERCED THE PRESIDENT'S THROAT.

THE GOVERNOR SAID HE THINKS HIS RECOVERY IS 90 TO 95 PER CENT COMPLETE, BUT HIS RIGHT SIDE IS WEAK, HE HAS SOME DIFFICULTY IN RAISING HIS RIGHT ARM AND HIS RIGHT WRIST WILL NOT TURN FULLY.

"I HAVE TROUBLE WITH A FORK, SO I GENERALLY EAT CONTINENTAL STYLE, OR WITH MY LEFT HAND. I CAN'T TAKE CHANGE WITH MY RIGHT HAND. . . I THINK I WILL GET GREATER FLEXIBILITY WITH THE WRIST. I DON'T HAVE THE STAMINA I DID BEFORE."

THE ASSASSINATION HAS MADE CONNALLY MORE WARY, HE SAID, AND HE THINKS TEXAS GOVERNORS OUGHT TO HAVE MORE PROTECTION.

"I WOULD NOT SAY I'M UNEASY, BUT I MUST SAY I'M MUCH MORE ALERT. . . . I THINK THERE SHOULD BE SOME MORE PROTECTION AFFORDED A GOVERNOR."

HE SAID HE AGREES FULLY WITH THE WARREN COMMISSION'S CONCLUSIONS THAT HE WAS NOT THE GUNMAN'S TARGET AND THAT LEE HARVEY OSWALD WAS THE PRESIDENT'S ASSASSIN.

THE REPORT "REFLECTS A DESIRE ON THE PART OF THE COMMISSION TO BE EXTREMELY THOROUGH AND TO RUN DOWN EVERY FACT OF THE ASSASSINATION OF THE PRESIDENT," CONNALLY SAID.

TEXAS ATTY. GEN. WAGGONER CARR EXPECTS TO RELEASE THIS WEEK A BRIEF REPORT ON TEXAS' ROLE IN THE INVESTIGATION OF THE ASSASSINATION.

THE GOVERNOR HAD HARSH WORDS FOR THOSE WHO IN SOME WAY BLAME DALLAS FOR THE PRESIDENT'S DEATH.

"I HAVE TRIED TO SAY IN EVERY FORUM THAT THIS DERANGED MIND, THIS MARXIST HAD NO TIES TO DALLAS THAT ANY OTHER TRANSIENT MIGHT NOT HAVE HAD. TO CONDEMN DALLAS BECAUSE IT WAS SELECTED FOR THE COMMISSION OF THIS DASTARADLY DEED IS UNWARRANTED."

HE SAID THE WARREN REPORT SHOULD "HAVE AN EXTREMELY SALUTARY EFFECT THROUGHOUT THE FREE WORLD" IN ITS FINDING THAT THE ASSASSINATION WAS THE ACT OF ONE MAN, ACTING ALONE, AND NOT OF A CONSPIRACY.

"THE CONSPIRACY RUMORS ARE PROBABLY COMMUNIST INSPIRED," THE GOVERNOR ADDED.
