"The Commission has found no evidence that the extreme views expressed toward President Kennedy by some right-wing groups centered in Dallas or any other general atmosphere of hate or right-wing extremism which may have existed in the city of Dallas had any connection with Oswald's actions on November 22.

Mayor Erik Jonsson said the first angry reaction of some toward Dallas after the assassination was understandable, but added that criticism has subsided in recent months.
