Warren Report— A Superb Work

THE WARREN Commission report is a magnificent masterpiece of soundly reasoned judgment.

It is clear, judicial, calm and meticulous in its determinations. All persons capable of restrained consideration of facts, and of discarding conjecture based on spectacular rumor, will accept the conclusions inevitably reached by the seven eminent Americans who with superb achievement realized their purpose: TRUTH.

Thus:

Lee Harvey Oswald killed President John F. Kennedy.

Lee Harvey Oswald killed Officer J. D. Tippit.

Jack Ruby killed Lee Harvey Oswald.

In each instance the perpetrator acted on his own.

There was no conspiracy, national or foreign.

The assassination of President Kennedy was the mad act of a disordered mind. The moody mind of a perpetually restless, disturbed brooder.

The protective preparations of the Secret Service, charged with guarding the President, were defective.

The co-operation of the Federal Bureau of Investigation with the Secret Service was inadequate.

The commission received the testimony of 552 witnesses. It examined vast piles of papers. It checked, rechecked and checked again.

It has produced a report that will settle the minds of vast millions who have awaited a definitive decision. This is it.

The commission makes forceful, pertinent recommendations. President Johnson has named a special committee of four distinguished men to develop a program to execute the recommendations. It is tragic that they were not in force last November.
