

Brother Sees One Oswald Question Left

WICHITA FALLS, Tex., Sept. 28 (AP)—Robert Oswald, 30, brother of the accused assassin of President Kennedy, said today that while he agrees with the Warren Commission report, one question still is unanswered.

"I can't help feeling that somehow someone originated the idea in Lee's mind, either directly or indirectly," he said.

"Up until yesterday I didn't make any public statements regarding this in the best interests of the investigation."

Oswald has lived here since July 1, when he became sales manager of the Acme Brick Co. He has been with the firm 4½ years and came here from Denton, Tex.

Asked "Do you agree with the report," he answered, "That is correct, I do."

He said he felt the entire investigation was "all very well handled" and that during the time he was in Washington last Feb. 20-22, he was "impressed by the great detail they were going into."
