The United States Government Printing Office sold an estimated 12,000 copies of the Warren report yesterday, officials said.

The report went on sale at the GPO's three bookstores here.

The \$3.25 cloth-bound edition outsold the \$2.50 paperbound edition by 2 to 1, officials said.

Demand for the report grew heavier as the day wore on. Bookstore manager George Hutchinson said he had seen "nothing to equal it" in 40 years with the Printing Office.
