Mrs. Carolyn Agger Fortas, a tax attorney with the Fortas Washington law firm, was asked about an article in the current

about an article in the current issue of the magazine Washingtonian that quoted her as having said that her husband had not wanted to be Chief Justice.

"He wasn't very anxious to have it," she said. "It's a lot of work."

President Johnson withdrew his nomination of Associate
Justice Forfas early in the fall
after the Senate refused to confirm it.

Asked about rumors that her
husband would resign as an Associate Justice, Mrs. Fortas
said, "It is not a matter under
current consideration."
