

Skolnick coming back to Chicago

Legal researcher Sherman Skolnick said he will return to Chicago Saturday. He called for an auto caravan to meet him in Detroit when he crosses the border from Canada.

In a recorded message on his telephone "Hot Line News," Skolnick said he would emerge from the tunnel linking Windsor (Ontario) and Detroit around 2 p.m. Chicago time.

He told The Daily News Thursday that he would seek political asylum and had barricaded himself in a motel room.

SKOLNICK disappeared Monday and drove to Canada because he said federal agents were after him. The legal researcher claims to have documents linking former Atty. Gen. John Mitchell to the Watergate case.

He also claims to have evidence that the CIA sabotaged a plane involved in a crash near Midway Dec. 8 that killed 45 persons.
