I have not seen, but I have heard of Fred Cook's Saturday Review review. Or dinarily, some of you would copy this and send it to me. I write because I expect some free copies from one who can make them without personal cost, so this appreciated kindness will not be necessary.

The remote possibility that I will overcome some of the other standard obstacles remains a possibility. A wire service has assigned the book to a reporters (DJ) and a TV net has.
