I had been assigned to OSS. I was a buck private. And I was assigned the job of writing the secret history of OSS and there were to be but a dozencopies in all made. I decided on a journalistic approach, to handle it as I would have done an in-depth picture-magazine piece, using pictures to the degree possible. This, ultimately, required my going to one of the secret training areas, and I picked one near the Quantico base. It happened that my immediate superior, a sergeant I'd worked for when he was a magazine editor, was not until then taking his basic training. So, as a joke, I had a baker mame a cake with a hacksaw in it. My driver was a 1st louis, my photog a civilian and I, a private, was in charge. That was Donovan, that OSS.
