My letter to Howard offering him a ride back from *hila last weekend was delayed reaching him. He phoned last night to see if he could come today. He is, for a week, He is returning 7/29. I am looking forward to seeing this very bright young man again. Generally he spends most of his time combing my files. I reminded him that the WG hearings will be on. He says he wants to miss none of them. I don't know what this will mean re Times clips, but if his paper will be delivered in his absence, I'll include a note. As this endless stroy develops, I become less concerned with having a complete file in my files for whatever future value there may be. Verbatim transcripts and stories of significance that do not appear elsewhere appear to hold more value. The Germans were to have mailed my notes back special delivery Wed. or Thurs. but as of Fri's mail they had not come. If they nix, I think I'll do the full foreword, intro, first and perhaps second chapters and, after Hunts testimony, send Inge Feltrinelli a summar rather than an outline of the planned rest. I am reluctant to outline a still-developing story even if there is an understanding it can change. To date, of the criticisms made of me, none, valid or not, has been of my integrity. The best publishers are untrustworthy about money, and this leads them to do strange things. "t took me about three years to get a WW accounting from Feltrinelli and when I got it, it meant nothing. Never got paid for Spanish and other uses. HW 6/23/73
