More U.S. prisoners of war arrived in the Philippines today. One Air Force colonel from Philadelphia referred to the bombing of Hanoi by the U.S. last Christmas in this way: "I was extremely pleased at the way things began to turn in 1972, and the blessed twelve days of Christmas.

There was a strange one on TV then silence. A one-man ship-ment by air, met by a track so close to plane he didn't show in footage. No word since. Some have made anti-war statements but I have not seen the face of any one or an interview with any one. Just like Friedheim was there in person. If there is such a thing. If HR sends, I'll forward.
