Weicker Wants Testimony From Former F.B.I. Aide

WASHINGTON, Oct. 12 (UPI)
— Senator Lowell P. Weicker
Jr., Republican of Connecticut,
asked today that a former F.B.I.
official be called to testify at
the Watergate hearings about
activities of the Federal Bureau
of Investigation that might
have affected the 1972 Presidential race.
Senator Weicker named William C. Sulivan, who headed
the F.B.I.'s intelligence arm for
nine years and later served as
a chief aide to the late F.B.I.
director, J. Edgar Hoover.
Mr. Weicker, a member of
the Senate Watergate committee committee, wrote to its
chairman, Senator Sam J. Ervin
Jr., Democrat of North Carolina, to "formally request" Mr.
