

## Wallace Doubts Warren Report

DALLAS, Tex. (AP)—Former Alabama Gov. George Wallace, who is touring Texas in hopes of getting on the November ballot as an American Party presidential candidate, said Thursday he thinks President Kennedy's assassination needs more investi-

gation.

Wallace's comments were made at an airport news conference in answer to reporters' questions.

He said he was not personally satisfied with the Warren Commission report on the assassination and he felt "the American people are not quite satisfied with the matter of it being a loner."

Wallace said he did not know of any evidence that had been suppressed. "I said several years ago that the movement toward the assassination of political leaders creates actions and reactions in the country," he said. "And that's going to continue in the country until we demand the justice department and our courts allow the jailing of those who violate the law."
