

Agnew Trial Delay

BALTIMORE (UPI)—The trial of former Vice President Spiro T. Agnew's son, James R. (Randy) Agnew, on trespassing charges in an alleged peeping tom incident was postponed Wednesday in local district court.

Agnew, 29, was charged with "trespassing with intent to peep" after Michael Frey and his 17-year-old wife accused him of peeping through their bedroom window in North Baltimore on July 7.

Prosecutor John Dunnigan said the trial was postponed until August 27 after Frey contacted him Wednesday and indicated he had changed his earlier decision not to testify against Agnew.

Dunnigan said that Frey had told Agnew's attorney, Joseph Pokorny, a few weeks ago that he did not wish to press charges against Agnew.
