Chester said he was not hired for Watergate-related courtroom work, which is being handled by St. Clair.
"All I know about it

(Watergate) is what I've read in the Columbus papers. Mainly, I'm trying to get caught up with what's been going on," Chester said.

Chester, 53, received a bachelor's degree in 1942 from Amherst College and a law degree in 1948 from Yale University. He served in the Navy during World War II.
