Suit Accusing Clawson

Of Lobbying Dismissed
WASHINGTON, July 30
(UPI)—A Federal judge Monday dismissed a civil suit by a Ralph Nader group that charged Ken W. Clawson, dicharged Ken W. Clawson, director of commmunications for the White House, with illegally trying to influence the outcome of legislation.

Judge Barrington D. Barker of United States District Court dismissed the case as being moot after Mr. Clawson

being moot after Mr. Clawson testified that he had with-drawn a set of speech kits that were the main object of the suit.

The kits, labeled "The Battle of the Budget 1973," were prepared by Mr. Clawson for government officials to use in a campaign to try to defeat several bills the Administration said would be inflation-

ary.

The Nader group, Public Citizen, Inc., contended that distribution of the kits violated a law forbidding Federal agencies from using tax

lated a law forbidding Federal agencies from using tax money in lobbying efforts.

The group asked Judge Parker to declare that distribution of the kits was illegel and to forbid Mr. Clawson and other Administratin officials from engaging "in similar misconduct in the future."
