

Nixon Advisers Get New Sites For Tax Trials

A federal judge ordered yesterday that the trials of two men charged with backdating then-President Nixon's tax records be moved out of the District of Columbia.

U.S. District Judge Oliver Gasch ordered the trial of former Nixon tax attorney Frank DeMarco Jr. moved to California and that of appraiser Ralph G. Newman moved to Illinois.

The two are charged with conspiracy to backdate the appraisal and tax records on Nixon's pre-presidential papers in order to qualify for an income tax deduction of \$576,000.

The indictment alleges that the papers, given to the National Archives, were backdated to show they had been made out prior to July 26, 1969, the date of a law reduced and restricted the deduction allowed for the charitable gift of pre-presidential papers.
