

Network voice: The Democrats say there may be more to the break-in and alleged bugging at Democratic headquarters than the seven men indicted by a Federal grand jury today. The Justice Department doesn't think so. In Washington, ABC's David Schumacher reports.

Schumacher: Justice Department sources claim the Watergate investigation is over despite charges from Democrat Lawrence O'Brien that a giant hole remains. O'Brien told us again this afternoon a special prosecutor should be appointed, to determine who funded the political espionage mission, an expensive month-long operation.

But according to a Justice Department spokesman, the grand jury and FBI investigation is complete; there is no evidence anyone else is involved. The spokesman later asked to change his statement to: there is no evidence anyone else should be charged.

Although the Watergate probe has ended the Justice Department reportedly is continuing its review of complaints of mismanagement of Republican fund-raising activities.
