WASHINGTON (AP) — William D. Ruckelshaus plans to dent Nixon that he would state the second se

take over as acting FBI director Monday with the intention of pursuing all leads turned up by the grand jury investigating the Watergate bugging raid, an aide says.

Press aide Jack Conmy told a newsman over the weekend that Ruckelshaus "is not simply going to be a caretaker di-

rector," although he told President Nixon that he would serve only temporarily—perhaps for two months.

Conmy said Ruckelshaus felt the FBI must "run down all leads turned up by the grand jury" in the Watergate case, which led to the abrupt resignation last Friday of acting FBI Director L. Patrick Gray III.
