The defendant was charged on Aug. 20 with one count of burglary and two counts of illegally transporting stolen Florida cars across the Mexican border. He is serving a provisional 40-year sentence for his participation in the June, 1972, burglary of Democratic national headquarters Washington's Watergate complex.

Sturgis pleaded innocent to the Miami charges in federal court here last Friday.

"The Mexican thing was really a CIA operation, and Sturgis was acting in that ca- 1 pacity," Rubin said. "We want all the ecords to substantiate this. If they can't or won't be I produced, the case should be dismissed."
