DETROIT, June 7 (AP)—The Federal Government has declined to hand over a set of wiretap logs to four defendants in an alleged Weatherman bombing conspiracy case here. Assistant United States Attorney Williem C. therefore the

Assistant United States Attorney William C. Ibershof told Judge Damon J. Keith of United States District Court that he had been instructed not to release the logs, which are summaries of the wiretaps. Judge Keith had ordered the

Judge Keith had ordered the Justice Department to release both wiretap transcripts and logs on the defendants after the Government admitted the taps were illegal. The transscripts were released immediately.

Mr. Ibershof said yesterday the Government would ask Judge Keith to reconsider his order on the logs, contending "there were other considerations" in refusing to release the logs. He did not elaborate.

The defendant and 11 others were indicted two years ago on charges of plotting a terror campaign during a Weatherman "war council" in Flint, Mich., in December, 1969.

2 Women Quit Navy

PENSACOLA, Fla., June 7 (AP)—Two of the first eight women admitted to the Navy's flight-training program have dropped out, Navy officials say. Ensign Jo Anne Hellman elected to quit after she was married to Navy Lieut. James Wilsey of Los Angeles, and Ensign Kathleen McNary of Plainfield, Ill., was dropped as physically unqualified for flying, officials at the Pensacola Naval Air Station said Wednesday.
