Nixon Sees Quadrupling Of Women in Top Posts

WASHINGTON, March 7 (AP)—President Nixon said today that the number of women in top government jobs had quadrupled during his first term and voiced hope that it would quadruple again in the next four years.

Greeting six Government career women selected for the annual Federal Woman's Award, Mr. Nixon also said that the problem was not so much one of finding good jobs for women but of "finding women willing to take them."

The six winners were Mrs. Bernice Bernstein, a regional director for the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare; Dr. Marguerite S. Chang, a research chemist for the Navy; Janet Hart, assistant director of the supervision and regulation division of the Federal Reserve System; Dr. Marilyn E. Jacox, research chemist at the National Bureau of Standards; Dr. Isabella L. Karle, research physicist in the office of naval research; and Mrs. Marjoria R. Townsend, a project manager for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.
