## Port 6119/73 Haldeman Moves To California

H. R. Haldeman, who wielded more power at the White House than anyone but President Nixon for more than four years, has quietly left Washington to await Watergate developments in his native California.

His attorney, John J. Wilson, said Haldeman and his family moved last week to Newport Beach, south of Los Angeles, where they have rented a home.

"They've gone," Wilson said in a telephone interview. "He'll come back when he's needed."

Haldeman, the White House chief of staff until he quit April 30, is scheduled to be a witness at the Senate Watergate hearings next month. Sworn testimony and published reports have linked him to the scandal, though Haldeman has denied any involvement either in the bugging of Democratic Party headquarters a year ago or its subsequent cover-up.
