WATERGATE DATA OF TWO CRITICIZED

SAN DIEGO, July 3 (AP)— Representative Bob Wilson, Republican of California, said Tuesday that H. R. Haldeman and John D. Ehrlichman, former White House aides, exhibited erratic memories in testimony before a Congressional inquiry.

He said the subcommittee was unable to learn from Mr. Haldeman and Mr. Ehrlichman how a White House request was relayed to the C.I.A. for undercover-type equipment to be used by E. Howard Hunt Jr., one of the convicted Watergate burglary conspirators.
