

Jim Hunt Grand Jury Testimony: Every piece in a while I skim something I regard as important to get the sense and then lay it aside, expecting developments to enhance understanding of what it does or can mean. Hunt's testimony was sent to the IA court in two takes. These pages are public. They were not all used in the Times (5/8/73). Martin Arnold's story says the first take was pp. 1-29, the second 31-37. Or, 30 was withheld, apparently. Now there was T reporting of some not here included, of which I am certain about the "safe house" on or just off Mass. Ave. There are many houses in that area. I have a hunch interest going back to my days as what would today be called a British agent. There was a house to which I went that is so close to what I saw on TV that it became a little provocative. Also, the excerpts begin at the end of Hunt's discussion of his covert activities. He then goes into the faking of the cables. But this is where the Times' excerpting begins, after whatever he said about his covert activity. If it does not cost too much, I'd like to go over those 36 or 37 pages. They have been released and should be available. If we can't get them readily by buying them, could we get a Senator to ask for them? I am confident they will disclose some of the things I suspect about his past, one of which I'll discuss tomorrow when you are here. HW 5/29/73
