Democratic national convention manager Richard J. Murphy said vester- come any and all career adday he has notified the ministration personnel at Nixon administration he will bar all politically ap-nointed observers from the Justice and Treasury Departments from the convention hall.

Murphy said he does not want administration operatives whose careers depend on a Republican victory next fall" taking part in the Deniocratic convention which opens Monday.

He said he relayed word of the ban to th eadministration through the Secret Service

and Miami Beach police chief Rocky Pomerance.

Murphy said he would welthe convention and said they could have any kind of credentials they need. But he said he wanted persons appointed by the President to stay away.

The Nixon Administration through the Justice Department, planned to station se-curity officers in the convention hall who would make decisions on the degree of force needed in case of any

Asked whether his decision was motivated by the break-in at Democratic national headquarters in Washington, Murphy said, "that certainly plays a large

Murphy said ten days before the break-in one of the men implicated in the raid. who is now a fugitive, was in the Democratic headquar-

I don't want them in the command post and I don't want then in the hall with what's been come on." Minphy said "It' is mappropriate and I will not stand for it A

He took pain to make a distinction between the Justice Department and the Secret Service, giving the Secret Service high marks for cooperation.

In contrast, he said, Justice Department officials. who have been in Miami. Beach for some time, never have "had the courtesy" to contact him.
