

When the committee had testimony from John Dean that Ehrlichman directed him to order Hunt to leave the country - and it is significant that Hunt, not Liddy, was told to become invisible and unavailable - and Ehrlichman pretended otherwise, and when it is known that Hunt fled Washington at least twice and was deterred in returning, the committee asked Hunt no question about why he left and the impediments to his return when he decided that is what he had to do.
