Tad Szulc's "Cuba on Our Mind," Esquire 2/74, is subtly anti-CIA right-wing, mostly on the Cuban population of Florida, and where it relates to CIA is obviously indebted to current CIA people as well as those who may have retired. He says there was a second invasion palnned in 1964-5, that Hunt was in on it and that it included a Castro assassination. Says aborted by Dominican "rebellion." He discloses what he did not in his Bay Figs book, that he covered it from Miami and he continues to hide what he knows of Hunt, despite what he says of it. This also makes clear that he had to have known of "Eduardo" in 1961 but makes no mention of the man or the role in the book. There are minor factual errors and a few new facts, these on the first two pages only. Interestingly, while it is an inherent plug for the book, there is no mention of it. EW 1/17/74
