Sirica Reply Deadline Is Monday

The U.S. Circuit, Court of Appeals yesterday set a Monday deadline for replies to an attempt by five of the Watergate cover-up defendants to prevent U.S. District Court Judge John Sirica from presiding at their trial.

Attorneys for the five asked the court to slep into the dispute last week after Sirica refused to disqualify himself.

Sirica assigned himself to the trial under court rules governing lengthy cases. The cover-up trial is scheduled to start Sept. 9.

In rejecting charges of bias in favor of the prosecution, Sirca said that "every action, decision and comment of the court cited by the defendants arose in the course of official judicial activity."

The defense lawyers charged, however, that the judge "failed to appreciate the disqualifying inconsistency be iween the judicial role he assistened himself in this case and his role in developing the indictments" charging their clients with obstructing justics. The appeals, court ordered
