Watergate Prosecutor Strengthened

Acting Attorney General Robert H. Bork issued a regulation yesterday designed to strengthen Special Prosecutor Leon Jaworski's investigation of the Watergate scandal.

The regulation orders that Jaworski's jurisdiction will not be limited without the approval of eight congressional leaders. It amends previously issued rules which require a consensus of the eight leaders before President Nixon could fire Jaworski.

The additional regulation says, "The jurisdiction of the special prosecutor will not be limited without the President's first consulting with such members of Congress and ascertaining that their consensus is in accord with his proposed action."

The congressional leaders are majority and minority leaders of the House and Senate and the chairmen and ranking minority members of the judiciary committees of both houses.
