I have been looking into certain pre-Watergate (circa early 1971) political activity on behalf of President Mixon's reelection which was directed from Washington and strongly focused on Illinois.

It was a covert dirty tricks operation and, from one source, appeared to be funded with monies advanced by you though not necessarily with your knowledge as to its purpose and scope.

More information needs to be developed to validate this operation before it can be determined whether it should be brought to the attention of Special Prosecutor Cox, the Senate Watergate Committee or otherwise published.

Your intent as published in today's Sun-Times of attempting to trace the utilization of funds supplied by you leads me to believe you might consider being interviewed by me.

I cannot be easily reached by telephone so it will be negessary to drop me a note.
